About Tomorrow's Equestrian Center

Tomorrows' Equestrian Center, Inc.'s (TEC) mission is to provide recreational and therapeutic riding to physically, mentally and emotionally disabled individuals. Riding improves posture, mobility, flexibility, muscle tone, coordination, balance, communication skills and self-esteem.

TEC, a non-profit, 501c(3), therapeutic riding program, provides services to Levy, Citrus, Alachua, and Hernando county's disabled children and adults, ages 5 and up. The program is offered at a nominal fee or is free to those unable to pay. TEC currently provides services, mainly on Mondays and Sundays to about 15 clients. We also have 8 therapy horses.

A typical riding instruction consists of 1-2 volunteers who groom, tack and exercise each horse before the client rides. If the client is capable of such work, they help in the preparation of the horse. The client then does a series of on-the-ground exercises to warm up. After mounting, the client rides and performs various drills while receiving instruction for approximately 45 minutes. Afterward, volunteers, "undress" the horse, wash and groom them. From start to finish, each lesson takes about 1 1/2 hours and involves 3-5 volunteers.
